COVID-19 Cases in Living Sky School Division from Sept. 27 to Oct. 3, 2021

A case or cases of COVID-19 were diagnosed in individuals in the following schools between September 27 to October 3, 2021:

- Spiritwood High School (1 case)
- Kerrobert Composite School (1 case)
- Cut Knife Community School (1 case)
- McKitrick Community School (5 cases)

*NOTE: Due to the number of cases at this school, Public Health have declared an outbreak. This means it is assumed there is an ongoing risk of exposure within the school. All eligible students and members of their household are encouraged to get vaccinated. Anyone not vaccinated is asked to get tested as soon as possible, this will allow for early detection and isolation of those who may be infected but are still asymptomatic.

We are working closely with Public Health staff to ensure necessary measures are in place to protect all students and staff.

Any individuals who were in close contact have been notified by the school or Public Health with directions. Following the division's health and safety protocols, the schools are receiving a deep cleaning/sanitizing and will remain open at this time.

Our school plans contain many important measures to decrease the risk of COVID-19 entering schools including promoting proper hygiene, implementing mask wearing, maintaining cohorts, and asking students and staff to stay home when experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms.

We remind everyone entering schools to monitor for any signs or symptoms of COVID-19. If you/your child has any symptoms of COVID-19, please call HealthLine at 811 and remain at home.
